To help adults pursue their personal goals by improving their basic skills through customized, research-based literacy tutoring in reading, writing, math and English as a second language.

Internships

Our unpaid internships focus on training and supporting individuals during a semester of experiences and learning. All internships are fitted to the individual career and educational goals of the chosen candidate. Our small staff will actively mentor you throughout the semester and give you ample opportunity to grow. Direct service and administration combine to provide a well-rounded internship.

ESL Group Coordinating	Tuesday and Thursday, 8:30-11am; Thursday, 2-4:30pm; and/or Wednesday, 5:30-8pm in Ann Arbor	Experience running vibrant existing program in partnership with Washtenaw Community College and the Ann Arbor Library system, supervise and develop team of volunteer tutors

- Attend partner meetings as a representative of Washtenaw Literacy
- Create and deliver professional development workshops for volunteer tutors
- Become certified in Proliteracy Adult Education model
- Pilot “needs inventory” in new learner assessment to determine wrap-around service needs of learners
- Manage e-newsletters with volunteers through Constant Contact communication system
- Attend community resource fairs representing our programs to potential tutors and learners
