- Welcome and work with learners who have experienced incarceration
- Support individual learner goals related to the group's theme
- Prepare flexible session plans and adjust to learner needs
- Communicate any planned absences to Program Coordinator in advance
- Follow Washtenaw Literacy guidelines

- Comfort meeting, welcoming, and working with new learners
- Flexible approach to tutoring, good at adjusting plans to unanticipated learner goals/requests
- Patience with low or irregular learner attendance
- Non-judgmental attitude towards learners who have experienced incarceration
- Enthusiasm for learning lab topic
