


Introduction to Pinterest

Pinterest is a [pinboard-style photo-sharing](#) website that allows users to create and manage theme-based image collections such as events, interests, and hobbies. Users can browse other pinboards for images, "re-pin" images to their own pinboards, or "like" photos.

Washtenaw Literacy is using Pinterest to share online resources for tutors and learners. [You do not need an account to access Pinterest](#) but an account will allow you to have your own pinboards, like and repin pins and follow boards.


Basic Introduction to using Pinterest to find Washtenaw Literacy resources.

1. Go to Pinterest.com



2. If you have an account sign in. [You do not need an account or to sign in to proceed.](#)

3. To find Washtenaw Literacy's Pinterest page go to pinterest.com/washlit


