Our Mission Statement

Believing that literacy is the foundation for a sustainable community, Washtenaw Literacy provides literacy support free of charge to adults through a network of trained tutors.

Our Objective

To help adults pursue their personal goals by improving their basic skills through customized, research-based literacy tutoring in reading, writing, math and English as a second language.

Internships

Our unpaid internships focus on training and supporting individuals during a semester of experiences and learning. All internships are fitted to the individual career and educational goals of the chosen candidate. Our small staff will actively mentor you throughout the semester and give you ample opportunity to grow. Direct service and administrative work combine to provide a well-rounded internship.

Prep100: Skill building for low-literate adults seeking their GED	Tuesday and Thursday, 1-4pm, in Ypsilanti	Experience developing a new program partnered with Washtenaw Community College, work with MSWs and Certified Teachers, supervise and develop team of volunteer tutors
Community Opportunity Center: computer lab for adults	Shifts available from 10-4pm Monday, Wednesday and Friday	Experience developing a new grass-roots program in partnership with multiple non-profits and faith-based partners, supervise and develop team of volunteer tutors
ESL Open Tutor Coordinating	Tuesday and Thursday, 8:30-11am; Tuesday, 7-8:30pm; and/or Friday, 1-2:30pm in Ann Arbor	Experience running vibrant existing program in partnership with Washtenaw Community College and the Ann Arbor Library system, supervise and develop team of volunteer tutors

Preference will be given to *qualified applicants* who can match the above scheduling needs. However, if you can not, you are still encouraged to apply as new program needs will arise.

Projects – Just a sample; project will be created and/or fitted to meet the goals of each intern.

- Assist with adult literacy data collection among homeless, food insecure, and other human services
- Attend partner meetings or community resource fair as a representative of Washtenaw Literacy
- Create and deliver professional development workshops for volunteer tutors
- Become certified in Proliteracy Adult Education model
- Develop tutoring materials for use in our jail program or Freshstart (clubhouse for mentally ill)
