Summary

Community tutors work weekly with Basic Literacy learners who drop-in for support. Tutors prepare materials for each session. This program offers inperson placements only.

Responsibilities

- Follow Washtenaw Literacy guidelines
- Attend a weekly
- Plan and facilitate sessions for learners, including preparing materials
- Encourage learner participation and goal setting
- Provide coordinator with advanced notice of absence
- Communicate with coordinator about learner needs

Successful Traits

- Comfortable with meeting a variety of learners
- Have a growth mindset
- Positive attitude
- Able to leave space for learners to share and practice
- Flexible with changing learners, variations in level, and changing group dynamics, including low or (sometimes) no attendance
- Collaborative and communicative with other tutors
- Proactively asks questions of staff
