

Jail Tutor

Summary

Tutors work with incarcerated learners in the Washtenaw County Jail, taking additional care to establish the relationship and determine the learner's goals.

Responsibilities

- Follow Washtenaw Literacy guidelines
- Obtain clearance to enter the Washtenaw County Jail
- Follow all Washtenaw County Jail rules and regulations
- Arrive at the Jail 30 minutes prior to program start time
- Partner with an adult learner for a two hour session once a week
- Plan sessions based on the learner's interests
- Complete a semester update at the end of the semester
- Communicate with staff about any support needed

Successful Traits

- Comfortable tutoring in an enclosed and highly regulated setting
- Empathetic and supportive for learners with trauma
- Flexible with last-minute learner absences and program cancellations
- Non-judgmental of the learner and their situation
- Committed to and able to encourage an asset-focused mindset
